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PASTOR'S PONDERINGS...

... in times like this...

‘MISSIO DEI—~ *The Mission of God!*’

Dear friends and followers @ New Life,

Just when I thought the church could slow down and pull back for the summer... I'm reminded the mission of God never stops! But, this summer we are all being called to take some new steps in a deliberate kind of re-shaping of New Life's ministry... or to be more accurate... this summer will be a time to test out some fine tuning and some honing of our whole lives to re-think our hearts, brains & courage. Blame the LEAD team. Blame the Church Council. Blame the leaders at New Life who met in February. And most of all... blame God as God's spirit is always calling us into the coming kingdom...

So, what can you and I expect of each other? Think of it like this...

Christians participate in the mission of God through every activity of life that expresses God's creativity, sustains God's creation, and cooperates with God's redemption. The church—including church-related organizations—is the one body exclusively dedicated to advancing the mission of God, so all Christians are part of the church. Of course, the church itself is not the kingdom of God, and church work is not the only way believers go about the work of advancing God's kingdom. As Dallas Willard put it, *'The church is for discipleship, and discipleship is for the world'*. Gathered in churches, Christians advance the mission of God through a wide variety of activities. Scattered into an amazing variety of workplaces, we have opportunities to advance the mission of God through daily work in every sphere of society. Anglican Bishop D.T. Niles of Ceylon (now Sri Lanka) pointed out that *'the Church is the only society which exists for the benefit of its non-members'*. I really like that thought as the church comes into contact with non-members primarily through its people's daily interactions with people in their places of work. Are you ready? Do you need an upgrade? Are your faith skills current or in need of being renewed?

Here's the critical piece ... a serious shift for people like us in times like this...

Greg Forster says it this way... *"God's mission is not primarily about getting people more involved in what churches are doing, but getting churches more involved in what God is doing in the world. It is a shift in emphasis from attracting crowds to equipping and supporting followers of Jesus for their work in the world. This is not to suggest that gathering for worship and church meetings is not still important. Rather these churches recognize the importance of both gathering Christians together and sending them out to do the work of God in the world. Sending people out has become a more serious attempt to forge stronger links in people's experience between one Sunday and the next in order to help them become more effective participants in God's work in the world."*

At New Life we say... "ROOTED in the Word,... REFRESHED in the Spirit... REACHING into the world!" May each Sunday be the great day you need for all other great days in between!

The Bible says in 1 Thessalonians, “give thanks in all circumstances; for this is God’s will for you in Christ Jesus.” So, I want to give as much thanks as I can to all those who have continually supported the fundraising for the Youth Gathering which is less than a month away! Without your faithfulness, generosity, love and sense of priority, we simply would not be able to go. In total, there are 2 chaperones (me & Aimee Castillo) and 9 students (1 female & 8 males). I think it is important to tell you that I believe in saving money also known as not wasting money. Thus, I was able to cut out 2 hotel rooms by joining with other churches (which helps them save money too!). Also, the Men in Mission were extremely generous by donating the entire Good Friday Fish Fry proceeds to the Youth Gathering fundraising efforts.

Having said that, I am asking you for your annual donations for Day Camp which starts in less than 2 weeks. Please take a post-it note from our display in the sanctuary and know that your generosity is being put to good use. The last 2 summers I have relied on certain families to house our Lutherhill staff; I am asking you to replace those families this year so that they can get a much deserved reprieve. Please let me know immediately if you are willing and able to do this. Day Camp is only 1 week this year so the burden is less. I am also hoping to give Mrs. Scott a break as our breakfast cook for the week. Please let me know if you can cook or make breakfast donations. Thank you in advance: Our Day Camp runs from June 11-15 with the theme, “Be Someone” (Ephesians 4:1-3).

Behind the scenes, I have been in contact with several local churches to see if we can combine our youth groups in various activities. Basically, I want our youth to go to other churches since their groups are bigger than ours. I am hoping that they will see familiar faces from school and possibly friends as well. I have been in contact with



Pearland Presbyterian, 1st Baptist, St. Andrew Episcopal, Friendswood Friends and Fellowship Bible. The last church is having a youth lock-in in July so we will be attending that. I hope to have at least 5 students go.

Parkland, FL. Santa Fe, TX. I never thought anything like that would happen near us. When I prayed for physical protection for the students at Berry Miller on May 10, the shooting happened at Santa Fe High School only 8 days later while I was at the Synod Assembly. I recently drove right past the school in April on my way to our conference meeting, as well. I am truly mortified; let us offer so much than thoughts and prayers. Some of the students at Berry Miller seemed to take me up on the challenge when I brought up the power of their vote. Will they remember what they have gone through in order to elect those who share their views and hope for change? I’m still idealistic that way.

A major goal for this summer is to send our kids to camp at Lutherhill. There are many weeks to choose from, but whatever week we choose between July 15 and August 10, I hope we can choose one where all of our kids can attend as one big group: 2nd & 3rd graders, 4th-6th graders and various weeks for 7th-12th graders.

I hope to see all of you this Sunday for our beginning of summer picnic on June 3rd.

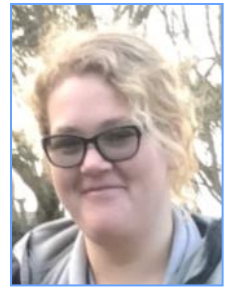

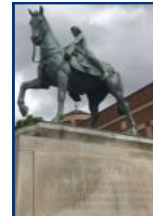

Reality held a Royal Wedding Tea Party fundraiser, so we spent the day watching the wedding, serving afternoon tea, and running a craft table for children. Hard times? Show up!

Everyone knows the gut-wrenching pain of a hard time. I am sure you have noticed, we are living through one in our world right now.

- When going to school is a life-threatening experience for students of all ages
- When going through a divorce
- When living with or accompanying terminal illness
- When abused or impacted by emotionally or mentally ill people
- When addicts are not working on getting clean
- When under or unemployed, unable to pay bills or feed children
- When a natural disaster rips our lives apart
- When death shocks us as dear friends, parents or children leave this world too soon

Life can be unbearable. The pain and suffering is real and it is all around us. *Lord in your mercy, hear our prayers.*

In hard times, how are we showing up for each other?

Sometimes hard times mean we must hit STOP on life as we usually live it. We can't just do what is on the calendar. It is more important to show up than to send a note, say a quick prayer, or talk by phone.

This is what it means to be incarnational.

It is easy to believe people when they say, "I'm okay," when we know in our hearts they are NOT. Their statement can give us permission to stay caught up in our own whirlwind. Stop doing this. There is truly nothing like being there.

Jesus lived this. Sometimes, like in the case of Lazarus's death, he showed up later than the family wanted, but he still came. Maybe one point of this story is to remind us that late is better than never when it comes to being with the people we love as they go through hard times.

Too many people are going it alone. They are surrounded by coworkers, friends and even family, that believe them when they say "I'm okay." We can tell ourselves, "it's none of our business." Or "I don't want to mettle." We are really just letting ourselves off the hook for not showing up.

If there is any reason to follow Jesus, it might just be to figure out how to love other people, even in (especially in) hard times. This is less about the church and more about the Christians. You know who needs you. Be there for them in a way that gives them the courage to heal. Don't back off on tough conversations because they are awkward. Stick your neck out, pray like crazy, and be Jesus in hard times. This is our watch.

Last week I went to my local super market and the first thing I noticed was the big displays of bottled water. In addition to the usual water aisle, there were stacks of cases of water bottles in several areas of the store. What a waste of space, money, and energy. Of course when the public water system has been compromised by a disastrous weather event or pollution, it is wonderful to have access to bottled water. However, for everyday use, tap water is just as safe, much cheaper, and avoids the cost of manufacturing the bottles and shipping the product. Actually, almost half the bottled water sold is just bottled tap water. Use a reusable drink cup and bottle your own water.

Drink bottles are made of polyethylene terephthalate (PET) plastics. They are recyclable, but only about 20 % are actually recycled. The rest end up in landfills, as litter, and in the waterways and ocean. PETs don't biodegrade, they photodegrade, which means they break down into smaller pieces over time and absorb toxins that pollute our waterways, contaminate our soil, and are hazardous to wildlife. When you do use bottled water, try refilling the bottle instead of getting a new one each time and always remember to recycle.

Turtle Patrol: Karen Sweet Cheney, Terri Kiser and MaryAnn Marcha are walking the beach from 61st Street to the Pleasure Pier in Galveston each Friday morning at 7am. We are looking for turtle tracks to find nests and help increase hatching rates. Texas Beaches have seen about 175 nests so far! If you saw my facebook post about the beach in Rancho Neuvo Mexico you get the idea of how many can be laying at one time. They recorded 8,000 nests there JUST during the Memorial Day weekend! Terri and I have been lucky



enough to see a nest being retrieved at Surfside (102 eggs went to the hatching barn at Padre) and a rehab turtle release at Stewart beach (10 Kemp Ridley turtles and 1 HUGE Loggerhead) during May. The news reported that 20 Greenback turtles were also released but they were not part of the group we saw. The released turtles were rehabbed at NOAA. One



we saw was missing a front flipper. We are very excited to share our photos from these events.

Be Prepared

This list of recommended items is not necessarily comprehensive or required. Use it as a guideline to create your own kit. You might add items you feel important and / or delete items to meet your needs.

2 Remember in prayer leaders and delegates gathered for the Southern Ohio, Allegheny, West-Virginia-Western Maryland, Florida-Bahamas, North Carolina, Northwest Synod of Wisconsin and Eastern North Dakota synod assemblies, that the Spirit will strengthen,

guide and encourage them for God's work in the world and growing the church.

3 Pray that travelers, vacationers and students on break will be renewed in their faith, life, work and relationships through experiences of sabbath, rest and play this summer.

4 Remember in prayer leaders and delegates gathered for the Upstate New York Synod Assembly, that the Spirit will strengthen, guide and encourage them for God's work in the world and growing the church.
