# Pastor's Ponderings...

...for people like us... in times like this...

# "WHAT DOES IT MEAN TO BE CHRISTIAN?—REALLY!"

Dear Friends and Followers at New Life,

"What does it mean to be Christian? Really?" is a question I'm often asked. After 35 years of parish ministry, I'm actually foolish to take that question on in a single page response in the church newsletter that no one has any way of verifying if anyone even reads it. Yet, with our being bombarded by so many electronic messages that I'd be crazy not to try. Just to prove my point when asked that question, I reply with one of my own... "In America? In Europe? In Ethiopia? Where?" For me, that at least makes the response worthy of partaking... for me & the one who asked... So... go with me here... it could be more fun than you think!

First, to be CHRISTIAN is to be called a dirty word! That's right. To be called Christian in the 1st century was not a term of endearment. Think "road kill" or "feral hog" because when people were called this first in Antioch ... it was not a compliment. Jesus called us friends... they did not! Start there. Move ahead one square.

Second, to be called "CHRISTIAN" meant that someone aligned their life with the life of Christ. Jesus has some good "catch" phrases that captured the hearts and minds of 12 men, then 70, then 100's then 1000's... not all on the same day, mind you, but over time as people responded positively to the call to "Follow ME" and "Repent and believe in the Good News!" To be a Jesus follower is risky. He invited himself to people's homes for a

meal all the time. They rarely refused. Try that with some folks you know... saying, "we're

coming over for Sunday dinner..." You might just end up eating at Central TX BBQ or Wendy's! You wanna be Christian? Well, then that might mean loving God with all your heart and mind and strength and loving your neighbor as yourself which is the answer Jesus gave when asked what the most important thing in life is... Yep. That kind of Christian... even though when we watch the TV news we don't really hear about a lot of that going on...

"A Christian is a perfectly free lord of all, subject to none. A Christian is a perfectly dutiful servant of all, subject <u>of</u> all, subject <u>to</u> all."

Third, while 90+% of America says they believe in God and recently reported 83% of America claims to be Christian... maybe being a good liar is one way of demonstrating your Christian faith as barely 20% of America is in a house of worship on any given Sunday. Do the math. And at least thank God you don't get caught in a traffic jam on Sunday mornings! In Luke's gospel, he reports that Jesus 'went to the synagogue on the Sabbath, as was his custom...' which sort of implies that people who follow Jesus will follow his lead on the importance of weekly worship. If you want to be Christian. Make a plan. Start with worship. Build your life's calendar around that. Jesus didn't have a day-timer or a smart phone. Worship was in the #1 place of his spiritual clock!

Fourth... my favorite number... first after any kind of holy Trinity... Fourth... "What does it mean to be a Christian?" I'm glad you asked... and if anyone pays any attention to the Gospels and the writing of St. Paul you see quickly that Christian really is a PLURAL term vs. an individual identity. OK... sure I know the between difference CHRISTIAN CHRISTIANS... but the truth is no one can be a Christian without associating with OTHER Christians... as Jesus made it real clear... "where two or more are gathered in my name...there I am in their midst..." which really makes it difficult for any one person to recognize the presence and power of Christ when there is no one else around to join in. Plus, Jesus never sent out anyone alone! Always in groups of 2 or more. In fact, all they way back to the beginning the "people of God" and 'Hebrew nation' or any other tag God's

people got... the mentioning was always in the plural... never in the singular!

Fifth and last... for now... To be a Christian is to find your place in the images mentioned in the Lord's Prayer and the Beatitudes. Google those terms... read them as if you had to live them every day! Luther was right when he said... "A Christian is a perfectly free lord of all, subject to none. A Christian is a perfectly dutiful servant of all, subject of all, subject to all." Our Christian living, therefore, is about BEING and DOING... about what we say and don't say and about what has been done and left undone! So, then, trust the GRACE that comes only from God that can move you to embrace your Christianity in a brand new way.

This past Summer Johnny performed in Upstate New York debuting an opera with Seagle Music Colony.



# **BABY CARE KITS**

### SOME IMPORTANT GUIDELINES TO REMEMBER

- Please include sizes between 6 and 24 months. Varying the sizes of the clothing items included will make the Baby Care Kit useful as the baby grows.
- Sweaters may be knitted or crocheted from leftover yarn, or made from heavy double knits or fleece.
   Select a pattern that suits your skill level. Preferred styles have buttons or ties down the front.
- Diapers can be made from flannel or even by recycling t-shirts. Download a Diaper Tip Sheet from our website.
- If knitting or crocheting receiving blankets, including one knitted/crocheted blanket and one flannel blanket will provide maximum versatility.
- Onesies can be cut and hemmed or serged to make a simple t-shirt.
- Gowns, rompers or top/pants sets can be substituted for sleepers.
- Gently used, clean clothing and blankets (no stains or tears) may be substituted for new ones. It is especially important that the items be in excellent condition, as used clothing is increasingly difficult to get through customs in many countries. Even one item that looks worn or stained to local officials can jeopardize the status of a whole shipment. All other items (diapers, towel, soap) in the Kit must be new.
- Please do not donate items with any religious symbols, messages or your group's name.
- Please do not donate any items decorated with a U.S. flag, patriotic or military symbols, or references to the armed forces, including camouflage.
- Do not add other items or leave out any of the items listed.
- Do not enclose the Kit or any of its contents in plastic bags.

# INCLUDE THE FOLLOWING IN EACH BABY CARE KIT

TWO lightweight cotton t-shirts (no Onesies ®)

**TWO** long- or short-sleeved gowns or sleepers (without feet)

**TWO** receiving blankets, medium-weight cotton or flannel, or crocheted or knitted with lightweight yarn, up to 52" square

FOUR cloth diapers, flat fold preferred

**ONE** jacket, sweater or sweatshirt with a hood, or include a baby cap

TWO pairs of socks

ONE hand towel, dark color recommended

**TWO** or three bath-size bars of gentle soap equaling 8 to 9 oz., any brand, in original wrapping; no mini or hotel size bars

TWO diaper pins or large safety pins

### HOW TO PACK YOUR PROJECT PROMISE KITS

- Wrap items in one of the receiving blankets and secure with diaper pins.
- Pack completed Kits, like items together, in boxes. Label contents in **LARGE**, **BLOCK LETTERS** on the outside of the boxes.
- Use strong cartons secured with packing tape, not to exceed 40 pounds.
- Do not use plastic or paper bags to pack donations.
- Include the name and address of your group or congregation on each box and label the contents

A few months ago, I commented on the first "R" reduce as the first way to avoid landfill waste. If we are careful not to purchase more than we need and to try to use the least amount of packaging possible, we won't waste as much.



The second "R" is reuse. When we pass used clothing or items on to others when we no longer have a need for them or use items in a different way, we are extending the life of the item and avoiding waste. I think the New Life Quilters are a prime example. Quilting is historically an excellent way for women of the past and present to use sewing scraps. Our quilters go the extra mile by using quilting

scraps for making pet beds. They use gently used pillow cases and stuff them with the scraps and sew them up. Actually the children do it. Julia Sweet started having her Sunday School class make them. They learned to baste them closed and then one of the quilters helped them stitch them on the sewing machine. This summer Camp Hope children made pet beds. Then they are taken to various animal shelters. Scraps get used, kids get a sewing lesson, and animals in shelters get comfortable beds. It's a win, win, win, win. Alleluia!

I am really looking forward to helping your little ones learn more about God and grow stronger in their faith.




### 3rd-4th Grade

# Lutheran Facts

### You Know You are a Lutheran If...

If you grew up Lutheran or not, if you've spent much time in a Lutheran church, you'll recognize some of these "truths according to Garrison Keillor". Likewise, if you've never been exposed to the Lutheran church, you'll really wonder about some of these. Trust a Lutheran – they are mostly true although not completely explainable or understandable!

I have made fun of Lutherans for years - who wouldn't, if you lived in Minnesota? But I have also sung with Lutherans and that is one of the main joys of life, along with hot baths and fresh sweet corn. We make fun of Lutherans for their blandness, their excessive calm, their fear of giving offense, their lack of speed, also for their secret fondness for macaroni and cheese. But nobody sings like they do. If you ask an audience in New York City, a relatively Lutheranless place, to sing along on the chorus of 'Michael Row Your Boat Ashore,' they will look daggers at you as if you had asked them to strip to their underwear. But if you do this among Lutherans they'll smile and row that boat ashore and up on the beach! And down the road!

Lutherans are bred from childhood to sing in four-part harmony. It's a talent that comes from sitting on the lap of someone singing alto or tenor or bass and hearing the harmonic intervals by putting your little head against that person's rib cage. It's natural for Lutherans to sing in harmony. We're too modest to be soloists, too worldly to sing in unison. When you're singing in the key of C and you slide into the A7th and D7th chords, all two hundred of you, it's an emotionally fulfilling moment. I once sang the bass line of "Children of the Heavenly Father" in a room with about three thousand Lutherans in it; and when we finished, we all had tears in our eyes, partly from the promise that God will not forsake us, partly from the proximity of all those lovely voices. By our joining in harmony, we somehow promise that we will not forsake each other.

I do believe this: These Lutherans are the sort of people you could call up when you're in deep distress. If you're dying, they'll comfort you. If you're lonely, they'll talk to you. And if you're hungry, they'll give you tuna salad!

# The following list was compiled by a 20th century Lutheran who, observing other Lutherans, wrote down exactly what he saw or heard:

- 1. Lutherans believe in prayer, but would practically die if asked to pray out loud.
- 2. Lutherans like to sing, except when confronted with a new hymn or a hymn with more than four stanzas.
- 3. Lutherans believe their pastors will visit them in the hospital, even if they don't notify them that they are there.
- 4. Lutherans usually follow the official liturgy and will feel it is their way of suffering for their sins.
- 5. Lutherans believe in miracles and even expect miracles, especially during their stewardship visitation programs or when passing the plate.
- 6. Lutherans feel that applauding for their children's choirs would make the kids too proud and conceited.
- 7. Lutherans think that the Bible forbids them from crossing the aisle while passing the peace.
- 8. Lutherans drink coffee as if it were the Third Sacrament.
- 9. Some Lutherans believe that an ELCS bride and an LCMS groom make for a mixed marriage.

(For those of you who are not Lutherans, ELCS is Evangelical Lutheran Church Synod and LCMS is Lutheran Church Missouri Synod. When and where I grew up in Minnesota, intermarriage between the two was about as popular as Lutherans and Catholics marrying.)

- 10. Lutherans feel guilty for not staying to clean up after their own wedding reception in the Fellowship Hall.
- 11. Lutherans are willing to pay up to one dollar for a meal at church.
- 12. Lutherans think that Garrison Keillor stories are totally factual.
- 13. Lutherans still serve Jell-O in the proper liturgical color of the season and think that peas in a tuna noodle casserole add too much color.
- 14. Lutherans believe that it is OK to poke fun at themselves and never take themselves too seriously.

And finally, you know you're a Lutheran when: \*It's 100 degrees, with 90% humidity, and you still have coffee after the service;

- \*You hear something really funny during the sermon and smile as loudly as you can;
- \*Donuts are a line item in the church budget, just like coffee;
- \*The communion cabinet is open to all, but the coffee cabinet is locked up tight;
- \*When you watch a 'Star Wars' movie and they say, 'May the Force be with you,' you respond, 'and also with you'. (If I can remember who they are, I will forward this to all my Lutheran friends, so they too, can smile as loudly as they can. I love that line!)

**12** We give thanks for the special work of the Evangelical Lutheran Education Association and for their support of Lutheran educators, ELCA schools and early childhood centers.

13 We remember in our prayers rostered and lay leaders who preach and teach the gospel and pray the Spirit fill them with a love of Scripture, wisdom, an enduring desire to learn and enthusiasm for sharing what God reveals for the world's sake.

- 14 Our congregations are blessed with Sunday school teachers and Bible study leaders committed to faith formation, witness and connecting God's word with daily life. We ask God to help us affirm their faithful service and cultivate their skills.
- **15** *National Hispanic Heritage Month* We give thanks for and honor the gifts and contributions of Hispanic and Latino Americans, and we pray for the growth of ELCA Latino ministries as they share the gospel and serve their neighbors in many different community contexts.
- **16** We give thanks for God's abundant love and patience with us and for creating in us faith and abilities that enable us—even with our personal flaws, weaknesses and appalling histories—to serve as leaders, workers and witnesses sharing the good news.
- **17** *Hildegard, Abbess of Bingen (died 1179)* We remember in our prayers women throughout history who have influenced the church, served as leaders and spiritual guides, and witnessed to the gospel through their faith, service and vision.
- **18** We ask God, in the midst of our wealth and abundance, to remind us of our neighbors living in poverty, hunger and illness and to not turn from their needs but to love, serve and respect them as our brothers and sisters in Christ, created in God's image.
- **19** We remember in our prayers civil servants, legislators and politicians and pray their work, deliberations and decisions consider the diversity of humanity, factors that contribute to communities flourishing and the well-being of people with critical needs.
- **20** We persist in bringing to God our concerns for peace and reconciliation in the world, especially where wars and violent conflicts continue to cause suffering, destruction and loss of life.
- **21** *Matthew, apostle and evangelist* Matthew grew from being a distrusted tax collector to being a fervent believer in Jesus Christ, follower and public witness. We pray our lives will also be transformed through faith to make us spirited witnesses to God's powerful love and presence in the world.
- **22** We remember in our prayers ELCA missionaries serving in Madagascar Kirsten Laderach, Hannah Kaitschuk, the Rev. Lancelot Themba and Kwena Mkhabela. We pray God will encourage and further their work in theological education, evangelism, interfaith dialogues and the Young Adults in Global Mission program.
- **23** By grace we have been saved through faith. We praise God for this gift of salvation through Jesus Christ and for welcoming us into the body of all believers through our baptism.
- **24** We pray for the Moravian Church, a full communion partner with the ELCA, and for the continuing growth of our relationship as together we share the gospel and do God's work in the world.
- **25** We remember in our prayers grandparents who surround their grandchildren with love, care, attention, and words and actions that witness to God's gift of love through Jesus Christ.
- **26** We ask God to teach us the differences between want and need, between greed and generosity, between self-interest and mutual care.
- **27** We give thanks for our partners in doing God's work in the world, especially companion churches in other countries, The Lutheran World Federation, the World Council of Churches and other ecumenical and inter-religious organizations.
- 28 We pray that we will—in the name of Jesus Christ—stand for justice for the oppressed, work to feed the hungry, welcome strangers as friends and demonstrate unwavering concern for all in need.
- **29** *Conference of Bishops* We remember in our prayers our 65 synod bishops gathered in Chicago to discuss our mission in the world and advise our church. We pray the Spirit will guide their efforts and God will grant them strength and wisdom in their work back home with their congregations, leaders and communities.
- **30** *Jerome, translator, teacher (died 420)* We give thanks to God for people who have gifts of speaking, writing and translating languages for the sake of serving others and sharing God's word in our diverse world.
