"THE 9.5 THESES"

[found on the wall of Zion Lutheran Church, Kerrville, TX]

- 1. The purpose of worship is to glorify and praise God for the goodness and love only God can give; worship is not to "meet the needs" of the worshiper.
- 2. The true mission of the church is not "just what we happen to be doing" but that which is done in obedience to Christ's commands and purpose.
- 3. The true intent of catechetical instruction is to teach a person how to grow in their relationship with Christ, not to give answers to a list of questions requiring no need of further growth.
- 4. The true measure of Christian maturity is not a matter of biological aging but a process of spiritual growth, rooted in God's Word, having an ability to respond to that same Word.
- 5. The true mark of Christian discipleship is the ability to translate the words of Jesus into human life and in examples that others can see.
- 6. The true service of a Christian is not in doing "church work" but the work of the Church. No activity can replace the need for Christians to witness to their faith in Jesus Christ as Lord. "Church work" can be a vehicle for witness, but it is never a substitute.
- 7. The true expression of Christian giving begins with the realization that all we have belongs to Christ who owns us by virtue of creation and redemption.
- 8. The true understanding of the Gospel is that no one is able to do any of the above without complete and sincere dependence upon Jesus Christ and the indwelling presence of His Holy Spirit.
- 9. The true need of every Christian is to daily repent and turn from human ways to God's ways by believing the good news that our salvation comes by God's grace and not by human effort.
- 9.5 The true expression of salvation is to believe that what God is doing in each of us will in time be brought to victorious completion.

As of November 1, 2017 the 500th anniversary of the Lutheran Christian movement is now 1 day older. May we find ourselves always reforming to seek God's will in all we say and do!

Below are several of the questions that we asked and the major themes that we learned. This is part one of the outcome. Stay tuned next month for part two!

What/who was it that drew you to attend New Life for the first time? The answer to this question was varied: invited by family member, moved into the area, looked for an ELCA church, baptism of family member or friend, liked the various ministries.

What was it that made you return? The overwhelming response was the friendly people who gave newcomers a warm welcome. Other answers included the services and Pastor Gigee's teaching as well as the smaller congregation.

What have you come to appreciate about New Life? In addition to comments about the friendly people, other responses included how everyone comes together when help is needed and how much the church supports so many community organizations. New members also appreciate the willingness of people to share their faith, their stories and their passion for God. The staff, open communion, and the fellowship were also mentioned.

This past Friday marked my return to the Reality Bus, and I am very happy and grateful to be back at work.

My fellow United Kingdom YAGM's and I attended a retreat at Cliff's College in Derbyshire from Tuesday - Thursday of this past week. We had a great time and got to see a truly beautiful part of the country. While there, we visited the Chatsworth House. The Chatsworth House is a breathtaking estate, and was actually used to represent Mr. Darcy's

home in the 2005 adaptation of Pride and Prejudice. I was blessed to have great friends who did not mind pushing me around in a wheelchair while we looked around the house and the gardens.

I plan to return after my foot is healed.

The past couple of months have been challenging and amazing. I've had moments of extreme loneliness, but have been blessed with a truly wonderful host family and host community. I've really come to love working on the Reality Bus. I mostly spend my time on the bottom level of the bus, which gives me the opportunity to make hot chocolates for and have fun conversations with some of the kids who come to the bus.



That's all for now! My official YAGM newsletter will go out later this week and will have a little more detail and many more pictures. I really cannot thank you all enough for the

support that you have given me.

26th Annual BBQ & Bazaar Appx. Financial Results (as of October 13, 2017)

Income: appx \$15,000 (not including \$1,750 in Thrivent Action Team Cards) almost same as 2016 Expenses: appx. \$6000

Charity Donations: Pending—to be calculated to reflect the new disaster recovery fund. (Appx. \$4,000)

Pending Expenses: appx. \$3100

Expected Profit: appx. \$4,000 (This is added to the previous balance for startup 2018 (need \$7,000) and used for New Life emergencies—cleaned red carpet in sanctuary, FH floor waxed, altar candles, testing snacks for Lawhon & bought new coffee maker for Fellowship Hall (last year profit was \$5,000)

According to Counting Room Records, Booths made appx.: (These numbers are reflected in the Income above) Baked Goods: \$722.50 (last year \$747.50)

Baked Potatoes: \$581.75.50 (after \$172.25 in BBQ for potatoes was deducted)

BBQ: \$5775.50 Last year: \$4752 + \$357 (Sun. Sandwich sales) + appx. \$800 (Brisket sales)

Drinks: \$441 + \$97 from snow cone booth (15%+\$10 water) last year \$736

Raffle Tickets: \$2523 (Pre Event ticket sales was appx. \$500)

Food Ticket sales brought in \$7,247.5 (Last year \$8,859.75), reflected in the booth profits. \$525 of this was marked as profit from the Children's area arm bands.



Monday, November 20 Open Garden Days by the Master Gardeners of Harris County will take place at 1205 Genoa Red Bluff from 8:30 A.M. to 11. Plants are on sale in the greenhouse.

Thanks to everyone who helped make our bazaar clean and green. There was almost no littering and the trash and recycling were properly placed. We collected 2 large bags of aluminum

The aluminum is sold and the money goes into the youth fund. The plastic goes into Pearland curbside recycling and the glass goes to the Stella Roberts Recycling Center, where it is put through the glass crusher and then used locally or sold. Sale of recycled materials helps to support the center, but it does not pay all the expenses. Recycling hazardous materials and staffing and maintaining the center costs more than what is taken in. Through a contract with the city, Waste Management collects the curbside recycling as well as the paper, cardboard, plastic, and aluminum from the center. In return, the city receives some money for the center operation which is managed by contract by Keep Pearland Beautiful. Waste Management is paid by the homeowners through the charge for trash collection on our water bills. Brazoria County also makes an annual contribution. That's why there is a small charge for accepting hazardous materials that come from outside Pearland or Brazoria County.

Recycling is not profitable, but it is the right thing to do. By diverting materials from the landfill, our landfills will last longer and maybe we can avoid using more property for more landfills. Recycling and reusing products can make our limited natural resources last longer. Responsibly handling hazardous materials can keep us safer and our land, air, and water cleaner and healthier. Keep Pearland Beautiful (KPB) is a nonprofit organization, dedicated to keeping our community clean, beautiful, and healthy through education, events, and managing the Stella Roberts Recycling Center. You can help support the Recycling Center by making a donation when you drop off your materials. You can help support KPB by becoming a member and volunteering, such as at our community cleanups.

These petitions are offered as guides to prayer for the global, social and outreach ministries of the church. Thank you for your continued prayers for the life and mission of this church.



1 All Saints Day Today we remember and honor saints, martyrs and loved ones who have gone before us and made an impact on our lives, the church and history. Pray for people who mourn the loss of someone they love or value that they find healing through the support given by friends, family and faith communities, and comfort from faith in Jesus' victory over death and the promise of eternal life.

2 *National American Indian Heritage Month* We give thanks for the gifts and witness of American Indian and Alaska Native members of the ELCA, 30 native congregations, new ministries and the work of the American Indian and Alaska Native Lutheran Association, all grounded in reconciliation and the mutual building up of the saints – people of all backgrounds, tribes, regions, communities, congregations and unique needs.

- 3 Pray for relief and recovery from the widespread destruction caused by recent hurricanes and storms across the Gulf Coast and Southeastern states, Puerto Rico, Haiti, the Dominican Republic, the U.S. Virgin Islands and other locations in the Caribbean. Pray our concern translates into actions, gifts, support and empathy for people and communities engaged in the long, hard and sometimes discouraging work of rebuilding and recovery.
- 4 Remember in prayer the young adults serving in the Young Adults in Global Mission program in Australia and their coordinators, the Rev. Kim Crawford and the Rev. Henry Martinez, that God will bless and further their witness and service alongside leaders of the Lutheran Church of Australia.
- **5** Ask God for clarity in discerning which leaders, teachers and prophets to trust and listen to, for the wisdom to know whom to follow and emulate as humble, disciples of Christ and to know that we have one teacher who is unfailing and trustworthy in leading us in God's ways and truth the Messiah, Jesus Christ.
- **6** Give thanks that our church believes that cultural, ethnic and racial differences should be seen and celebrated as what God intends them to be blessings rather than means of oppression and discrimination and pray for courage and self-reflection to face and change the uncomfortable things within ourselves, culture and society that selectively cause suffering and harm of others.
- 7 On this day when elections are taking place across our country, we pray the Spirit of God will guide our church and members in defending human dignity, standing with poor and powerless people, advocating justice, working for peace and caring for the earth in the processes and structures of society.
- 8 When we experience criticism or oppression for our faith and living from the gospel, pray for renewed faith and trust in God's light and truth that lifts our spirit and encourages us forward as bold disciples serving our neighbor and sharing the good news of Jesus Christ.
- **9** We remember in our prayers leaders gathered for the ELCA Church Council, that they are inspired and led by the Spirit in all they do and in helping our church pursue and keep before us God's work in the world.
- 10 Though our celebration of the Reformation may seem marked in time and history, we ask God to help our church to be always open to change, growth and reform centered in Scripture and the gospel for the sake of doing God's work in the world.
- 11 *Veterans Day* While war and conflict between nations and people are unfortunate aspects of our human nature and weakness, we pray God will continue to reveal and shine a light on God's paths and ways of peace, justice, reconciliation and mutual concern. Give thanks and recognition for the sacrifice of men, women and young adults who choose to serve and have served in the past our country in pursuit of global peace, justice and the well-being of all God's people.
- **12** Pray that every aspect of our life in the present is influenced and guided by our faith and God's word, making us determined and equipped to serve our neighbor and share the gospel now.
- 13 Pray for the people and communities recovering from the strong earthquakes in Mexico, and ask God to guide the work and partnerships of Lutheran Disaster Response and our ecumenical partners accompanying people during this time of loss and rebuilding.

- 14 Remember and give thanks for the United Church of Christ, a full communion partner with the ELCA since 1997, and ask God to deepen our partnership and bless our work together sharing the gospel and serving our neighbor.
- 15 In our striving for wisdom, we ask God to instill in us a lifelong desire and openness to studying God's word and learning and to help us become wise yet humble teachers, leaders and examples in our congregation and community.
- **16** Pray for the members, congregations and leaders of the Caribbean and Florida-Bahamas synods facing the long-term process of rebuilding and caring for storm-ravaged communities and people who have experienced great loss and ongoing challenges. Ask God to strengthen and sustain them for supporting one another, reaching out to and caring for neighbors, sharing hope and witnessing to God's enduring love and presence.
- 17 Pray the Spirit will stir in us a love of telling our children, grandchildren, family, friends, coworkers, strangers and the world stories of the wondrous things God has done.
- 18 We remember in our prayers people who are homeless or on the verge of becoming homeless, praying they find safe shelter and that our congregations are caring communities assisting people with housing, food, employment and services necessary for daily life while respecting their dignity and desire to be self-sufficient.
- **19** Pray we are not consumed with maintaining the status quo, defending institutions to preserve comfort or familiarity, or hiding the resources God has entrusted to us but that we freely use our blessings and assets and take risks for the sake of mission, service, witness and purposeful change.
