PASTOR'S PONDERINGS...

... for people like us ... in times like this...

"What's LOVE Got To Do With It?"

Dear friends and followers @ New Life,

What's LOVE got to do with it? A lot. And it's not easy. The Bible has this cruel wake us up attitude that LOVE is more than a feeling. It's actually and 'action verb.' Get it? ACT-ually? Whether it is the verb 'philia' as in love for a friend... or 'agape' as in Godly love or 'eros' as in sexual love they all require movement. Jesus reminded us to 'love our neighbors.' St. John wrote that "God loved the world so much he sent/gave his only son...' and in the commandments we are offered some limitations and protections for our sexual behavior... even to the point of coveting or lusting... which in the latter case may lean more toward feelings... but those feelings obviously can lead us to actions that can be regrettable.

So, what is it that in the music we sing that teaches us about LOVE? Are the lessons good ones? Do the lyrics help us? Challenge us? Unnerve us? Mislead us? The bigger broader question is what songs have you truly taken to heart that fuels your living? Church songs? Culture songs? Some of both? If you are like me you probably say both... and that's just fine... after all we all are 'simul Justus et peccator..' at the same time saint and sinner... but, here's a distinction... and a caution... the Church songs we sing will always lead us to Godly actions... and the culture songs we sing often don't. Note: I don't think songwriters write songs to get you into trouble, those are songs written about someone who already did... and here's a short list of songs to help and to remind...

Congregational Meeting

Sunday, February 10th After the 10:30 am Service

Take Your Next Step

Our journey into whole-life stewardship began in January of 2018 with a council discussion about our purpose as a congregation and people of God: Stewardship! The general view was that stewardship is about the money. Our realization, though, is that stewardship as a way of being God's people is certainly not all about the money.

So we set out to redefine stewardship as a whole-life way of being. After much planning, we introduced the concept of whole-life stewardship to the congregation at the congregational meeting, which to be frank, was sparsely attended. Thus, we set out to introduce the whole-life concept with weekly Stewardship Corners in the bulletin, monthly testimonies during worship, and a summer reading program to engage everyone in personal conversations about stewardship and what it means to be a whole-life steward.

The personal stories and testimonies were very moving. The Stewardship Corners began to be used by families at home and are hopefully making an impact on your life. Your council members read several books and recommended a final reading list; however, very few members participated in reading the books. The summer reading program was pretty much an epic fail, as the kids today would say.

Looking back on this past year, the leaders of the congregation wonder where do we go from here? As council members, we knew that changing the way of being New Life is not a campaign or year of missional emphasis, but an effort that will take many years of undoing habits and mindsets while thinking and doing things differently. So whole-life stewardship continues to be our message to you. We will continue to ask you to redefine stewardship in your life as a way of being a disciple of Christ every single day of the week in every aspect of your life.

The key is your discipleship as a steward of God and you living into that way of being in your whole life, which is both financial and time consuming and both familial and communal. From wherever you are on your journey to be a whole-life steward and disciple of God, we call on every confirmed member of this congregation to self-identify and take your next step. This next step is a call to action for you to be a committed, engaged, and present disciple in the missions of this congregation. Here's some food for thought on stewardship and discipleship:

Excerpts from Brett Elder's "Stewardship and Discipleship: Two Sides of the Same Coin"

The biblical model of stewardship encompasses how we cultivate the entire world. Whatever you do, Paul says in Colossians 3:23-24, work heartily, because whatever you do you are serving the Lord Christ!

Two fundamental questions to understand stewardship in all its fullness are:

For whom exactly are we managing?

Dozens of passages throughout scripture point to God's uncontested ownership. In fact, at no time do we ever read of God relinquishing ownership of anything that he set in motion. The cash in our wallets, the children in our families, our creative capacities, the air we breathe, and the gospel message itself—tangible and intangible; all belong to God.

At face value, the idea of God's ownership of all things does not appear to be a profound insight until we consider the *why* of stewardship. Why would an all-knowing and all-powerful God entrust us with any of his stuff? I would suspect that a God who so capably and intricately set this world in

motion could manage "every inch" of his creation without our help. Don't you?

Second, if God does not *need* us to manage on his behalf, *why* have we been given stewardship responsibility?

Part of the answer is that God is ultimately gracious and benevolent toward us. He chose us to manage on his behalf. A close study of scripture identifies at least seven purposes for our stewardship of God's stuff:

- Unique calling: a prompting toward fulfilling our unique role in the Body of Christ
- Unquestionable character: a prompting toward who we are called to be as individuals
- Unquenchable compassion: a prompting toward placing others' needs before our own
- Undying commitment: a prompting toward obedience to God regardless of the cost
- Unparalleled commission: a recognition of the privilege to share in the fulfillment of God's mission
- Unwavering conformity: a prompting toward conforming to God's will and desires
- Unending celebration: a constant expression of worship as God's stewards fulfill their calling

As Christians, we bear the image of God. This is a profound stewardship responsibility in and of itself. Stewardship is the path God uses to make us into the people he wants us to be. Our obedience and intentional stewardship of "every square inch in the whole domain of our human existence" provides us with an opportunity to vividly reflect his image and be His disciple.

So what does the steward-disciple coin look like for you personally?

That answer and your next step depend on where you are right now.

- For those who are already engaged and active disciples with your time and your financial giving, we asked you to be present and be the water on the seeds that are being sown in this congregation.
- For the parents, grandparents and caregivers of children, your next step would be to bring your kids to worship and Sunday school and be present and consistent with nurturing their daily faith lives.
- To our young confirmed members, your next step would be to assess the priorities in your young life and find the balance that brings you to be present and engaged in this congregation at least weekly.
- For our young adults who are far from home, your next step will be to find a faithful place to worship and be present to engage in faithful conversations where you are while staying connected to us at home.
- For the seniors of our congregation, your next step would be to be present in engaging the community around us and model faithful discipleship to the younger generations.
- For those who don't know where to start, call Tiffany for assistance to match your spiritual callings with the needs of the church and community.

Above is an incomplete list of our congregation's demographics, but there is a common theme: be present—figuratively and literally. Whether you're a student, a single adult, a young married couple, an empty nester or soon to be, a widow or widower, a divorcee', young or old, retired or not, or a visitor—there is a place for you here! Each of us in this congregation has to do the work to find that place. Take your next step.

On Sunday, January 6th a collection of almost 150 pounds of food and 20 pillowcase beds were delivered to the Animal Shelter on Old Alvin.






















The 4th-6th grade Sunday's Cool class has been using "The Action Bible" and they LOVE it!





Thursday, February 14, the monthly garden lecture at the Pearland Recreation Center is about bluebirds. The lecture begins at 7:00 P.M.



Saturday, February 16 is Orange Street litter cleanup day. Meet at the church at 8:30. I mistakenly announced last week that it was this Saturday, but the city wide cleanup is on the 16th.



Monday, February 18 is Open Garden day at the Harris County Master Gardeners "Genoa Friendship Garden" on Genoa Red Bluff at 9am. Come enjoy the multiple gardens, orchards and flower/herb gardens. There are always plants on sale in the greenhouse as well.

Last Saturday I obtained two trees for our property from the KPB tree give away. They are a red maple and an overcup oak. This is the season to plant trees while they are still dormant. I placed a stack of tree brochures in the administration office. You can see the native and adaptive trees that do well in our area and a complete guide to planting and pruning trees. Pick one up if you are interested and if we run out, I will be able to get more.



Since 1988 the Texas A&M Forest Service has had an ongoing cooperative program with parks and communities mostly in central Texas to suppress oak wilt. It is a highly contagious fungus disease that is killing red oaks and live oaks. It is often spread by beetles that carry spores from diseased trees to healthy trees. It mostly enters through an injury from pruning, storm breakage, or squirrels and other animals. Some prevention tips are to seal cut areas after pruning with a wound dresser or latex paint. Avoid pruning between



February 1 and June 30, since infection usually takes place in the spring. Clean pruning tools with a 10% cleaning solution and prune correctly. Don't top off branches but cut off limbs near the trunk or where a branch joins a limb. So that the weight of the limb doesn't rip off the bark, cut twice, once away from the trunk and the final one just outside the limb's collar. The tree guide has an excellent description of proper pruning.

Symptoms of oak wilt on a live oak are yellow or orange veins in the green leaves that eventually turn brown. In the red oak, you might see red coloring along the edges of the green leaves. You would notice it in the spring when healthy leaves are green. If you suspect you have a tree that has oak wilt, it will need to be removed. To verify, check with Pearland's Urban Forester, Jerry Bradshaw at jbradshaw@pearlandtx.gov

These petitions are offered as guides to prayer for the global, social and outreach ministries of the church. Thank you for your continued prayers for the life and mission of this church.



1 *Black History Month* Give thanks for our sisters and brothers of African descent, who have both suffered much and contributed much to our nation and the ongoing work of building a multicultural church and restoring and reconciling communities in the name of Jesus Christ throughout the world. **2** Give thanks for children and youth in our lives and congregations, for the gifts they bring to the body of Christ and for the leaders, teachers and members who nurture and encourage them.

3 The good news of Jesus Christ, God's love and the promise of eternal life bring us joy, but we sometimes find ourselves troubled and irritated by God's desire for us to exercise justice and peace and immerse ourselves in serving our neighbors in need – without hesitation or prejudice. Pray the Holy Spirit will work in our hearts to change our attitudes, bias and self-centeredness, setting us free to be willing, committed disciples and servants in the world.

4 Remember in prayer regions of the world embroiled in conflict and turmoil, that leaders of nations and people involved and impacted will work together for peaceful, just and lasting resolution and reconciliation; pray especially for the safety and well-being of people who have and continue to suffer loss, disrupted lives and displacement from their homes, communities or nations as a result of violence, persecution or economic collapse in these areas.

5 Remember in prayer ELCA missionaries serving in collaboration with the Japan Evangelical Lutheran Church, especially in ministries of evangelism and education. Give thanks and pray for the 18 international leaders who have received ELCA educational scholarships to further develop their skills for service in the church in Japan.

6 What is love? Where is it scarce or misguided in our relationships and how we live out our faith? Ask God to deepen and mature our understanding of love and center us in the love we, as baptized children of God, are called to share generously with others.

7 Thank God for the special relationship we have with the Episcopal Church, a full communion partner with the ELCA since 1999; pray for the church, its members and leaders, and that together we find strength and new resources for the work of sharing the gospel and serving our neighbor.

8 The Lord is our refuge, rock, protection, hope and trust throughout life. Give thanks and praise!
9 Give thanks for the work and impact of ELCA World Hunger. Pray we all seek ways of being working, generous partners in breaking the cycle of hunger and poverty, providing immediate and long-term assistance, and bringing hope to individuals, communities and regions of the world that suffer from hunger and poverty.

10 Consider what stirred you to follow Jesus and grow in faith. Pray for the Holy Spirit to fill you with courage and confidence to invite others to believe and follow.

11 Pray for our seven ELCA seminaries, that their faculty and staff are strengthened, inspired and sustained in their work of preparing men and women for public ministry in a multitude of contexts and communities here and around the world.

12 Give thanks for entrepreneurs of all ages in our congregations, and pray we value their energy, ideas, skills, curiosity and creative perspectives as assets that can be used for ministry and serving our neighbor.

We partner with the local church and organizations to respond to health, hunger and leadership development needs; 10 international leaders have received scholarships to further develop their skills for service in the church in China. Give thanks to God for what we are able to accomplish through working together.

- 15 Give thanks for the good news of Jesus Christ that we have received through faith, and pray we eagerly and unashamedly work to proclaim the gospel in the world with all who will listen with friends and strangers alike.
- **16** Continue to pray for and support parents, families, friends and communities that have suffered the tragic loss of loved ones as a result of gun violence. Pray we are filled with empathy and care for the long and difficult healing they may go through, and that the Holy Spirit will help us be bold, wise agents and advocates of change to prevent and end the violence across our nation.
- 17 Jesus compels us to serve our neighbor and be a blessing to others friends, strangers, enemies, outcasts, hungry and poor alike. Thank God for inviting us to join in God's work in the world and ask for the Holy Spirit's guidance and help with the service and challenges to which we have been called.
- **18** *Martin Luther, died 1546* Give thanks for the life, faith and teachings of Martin Luther, who worked with tenacity and courage to serve Christ while also confessing his personal struggles, questions and human weaknesses; pray we, too, are faithful in our baptismal journeys and not easily discouraged by the complexities of life, risks and our self-doubts.
- **19** Lift up thanks and praise for our life with God, a life filled with promise, hope and blessings that nourish us each and every day; a life and relationship that God desires for all people.
