Walk in Newness of Life Pastor Clayton Faulkner

As we celebrate our first Christmas together, I am overwhelmed with gratitude for your many displays of generosity. Thank you for the honor of being your pastor. It is a sacred responsibility to be the spiritual shepherd of the New Life church community. I am humbled to be called by God and by you in this season of hope and joy. The birth of Jesus reminds us of how God can do powerful things through small, surprising ways. God's peace and blessings be with each of you and your families in these holidays. Thank you for your trust.

Christmas and the holiday season can be a complicated time for people. Despite all the glitter, cheerful lights, and shiny wrapping paper, for some the holidays are not merry and bright. Perhaps this is your first holiday season without someone you love. Or there has been a growing distance between the people in your family. Or this season brings up feelings and revisits past trauma that are not easy to deal with.

There are lots of reasons why the holidays are a struggle for some. It's important that you hear the church say this: you are not alone. No matter the circumstances, you are always a beloved child of God and this is a place where you can be your true, authentic self and not hide from God who you really are.

Grief and loss are not things anyone is immune to. At some point in life, you will face them. If you're not experiencing grief and loss currently, it's because you already have recently, or because it's just ahead in the near future. Grief and loss are engrained to the experience of being human.

Often when you experience grief and loss it feels like living in a perpetual nighttime. The sun doesn't rise. We are left in the dark with our emotions and it's difficult to make sense of why things are happening. The church can help and offer you support when you're facing these circumstances.

At the end of January, we will begin a GriefShare support group. GriefShare is a weekly support group ministry designed for anyone struggling with loss. The 13 video seminars feature respected Christian counselors and leaders who share wise insights about grief-related topics. These dynamic videos also include personal testimonies from people who have lost a

loved one. The workbooks contain a note-taking outline for the video sessions, a daily Bible study that reinforces the information presented on the videos, a gospel presentation, helpful articles, and insights from the Christian experts.

This 13-week support group will take place on Mondays at 6:00 PM, beginning on January 30, 2023. It will be co-led by Aimee Castillo and myself. Aimee is someone who has experienced a profound loss in her life and has participated in a GriefShare group previously. According to Aimee, "It really helped me last year and I would like to do the same for others."

Every weekly session will include time to check in, viewing a video with teaching from grief recovery experts, and group discussion. Group members will share about what they've seen in the video, explain how their daily GriefShare workbook exercises are helping them see their situation from God's perspective, and share the challenges they're facing and victories they're experiencing.

- 5. Grief and Your Relationships
- 6. Why?
- 7. Guilt and Anger

- 10. Lessons of Grief Part One
- 11. Lessons of Grief Part Two
- 12. Heaven
- 13. What Do I Live for Now?

Please share the news about this group with them. Even better, bring them with you to the group. You can sign up in the Narthex or let me know that you'll be attending.

New Life is a place of love and encouragement. We are here to lift one another up and bear one another's burdens. God's peace is with you as you begin a new year filled with new possibilities.



Merry Christmas everyone. At Least Lutherans know that the first of the 12 days of Christmas is Christmas Day and goes on to Epiphany and not a countdown before Christmas. So, I'm assuming your tree will be up a while after Christmas Day. If it's a live tree, there is still a worthwhile purpose for it after you undecorate it. It can go to the Dunes Project to help rebuild sand dunes for coastal protection against storm surge and high water during tropical storms. Artificial trees and flocked trees are not accepted. If you have a live unflocked tree, be sure to remove all ornaments and tinsel and then take it to the Stella Roberts Recycling Center (SRRC) to drop it off at the entrance gate. Trees will be accepted from December 25 until January 14. The Center will be closed from December 24 until January 3, but you can toss your tree over the fence at the entrance.

Another option is the Brazoria County Precinct 2 Work Yard, 7315 Corporate Dr. Manvel, TX, Monday through Thursday, 7:30 A.M. to 5:30 P.M.

If you put it out for curbside pickup, it will go to the landfill. I you have an artificial tree you wish to dispose of, you may bring it to the Recycling Center for recycling.

Dunes Day will be January 21 from 9 A.M. to noon. Volunteers will meet at Stahlman Park in Surfside Beach to build, restore, and strengthen our dune line against storm surges. Leader Huddle: All congregational leaders are invited to this meeting on Saturday, January 14 at 9:00 AM.


Special Guest in Worship: On Sunday, January 15, Mary Lynn Mennicke from Lutheran Summer Music will be our guest and provide special music.
