

Walk in Newness of Life Pastor Clayton Faulkner

The most exciting thing happening in the month of August is the return of school! Just kidding, most students probably don't think that is exciting or even bearable. Regardless, school will be back, like it or not. There are exciting parts, like renewing friendships and new school clothes. But there are also stressful parts, like unfamiliar buildings and the fear of being bullied.

God doesn't promise that the fears we face can be avoided. God does promise to go with us and uphold us in love no matter what challenges we run into. Our job is to walk in faith, trusting God for the things we need, and seeking ways to love and serve our neighbors in whatever way we can.

It's important that we stop and pray for God's wisdom and protection at the beginning of a new year. That's what we do on Rally Day, which is Sunday, August 13. During the worship services that day we will include a backpack blessing. This is a time of prayer when we recognize everyone that is returning to school, from Pre-Kindergarten all the way through graduate students, and not forgetting the teachers, administrators, and other personnel that make schools function.

The return to school is also the return to Sunday School. Christian learning is part of the call to discipleship. As followers of Jesus, we are all on a life-long journey of learning. This includes learning about the Bible, learning about our Lutheran theology, and growing in wisdom through faith. Our church will have a variety of learning opportunities available for every student from the very young to the very experienced on Sunday mornings at 9:15 AM.

Another part of Rally Day is our gathering at 9:15 AM in the fellowship hall. We will use that time to kick off our new year of Sunday School. We will enjoy some food, sing a few songs, and meet our Sunday School leaders for the year. We will pray for them and their ministry among us. This is also a meet-the-teacher time where students can get acquainted with their leader and find their meeting space. The following Sunday, August 20, classes will begin. I'm looking forward to leading the confirmation students (7th and 8th graders) and their parents again.


Engaging young people and encouraging their faith development is one of the priorities of our church. Earlier this year, Pastor Tracey Breashears Schultz posted a summary of a book regarding churches that want to grow younger by engaging families with children. The key finding of the book: you have to listen to young people. What a novel concept! Churches can try to lure families with lots of bells and whistles, but in the end, nothing replaces asking a question and listening to the response.

The book goes on to summarize six core commitments young people are looking for in their church communities:

- Empathy. Youth want to spend time with adults who will model for them how to navigate grief, how to be vulnerable, and how to cope with everything new the world presents. Rather than being "buttoned up," as some generations have been, this is an invitation to be authentic, to refrain from judgment, and to let youth in.
- Warm relationships. Relationship is so much more important than any "cool factor."
- Jesus-centered community. Youth are interested in the good news of Jesus (and less interested in Christianity), which means they look to the adults in their churches to learn about witnessing or "walking the talk."
- Prioritize young people everywhere. If youth really matter, then
 don't give lip service to their importance. Involve them in all
 facets of ministry and congregational life. Give them a voice and
 a budget. Allow them to serve.
- Be the best neighbors. Ask: who is my neighbor? Courageous neighbors embrace ethnic and socioeconomic diversity. They look for ways to neighbor well, whether that's by serving or listening. How can our churches be more for the community?
- Keychain leadership. "Keys refer to the capabilities, power, and access of leaders who carry the potential to empower young people." Which young people are ready for keys, not necessarily to the building (although it can mean that), but who is ready for training and leadership? Who needs to step down to let a new generation lead?

These ideas are both challenging and worth pursuing. Jesus welcomed the children and encouraged others to let them be in his presence. What can New Life do to encourage the same?

SCHOOL KIT ASSEMBLY INSTRUCTIONS

Include the following items in each School Kit:



One sturdy drawstring backpackstyle cloth bag, approximately 14" x 17", with shoulder straps (no standard backpacks)



Four 70-sheet notebooks of wide- or college-ruled paper, approximately 8" x 10½"; no loose-leaf paper



One box of 16 or 24 crayons



One 30-centimeter ruler, or a ruler with centimeters on one side and inches on the other



One pencil sharpener



One pair of blunt scissors (safety scissors with embedded steel blades work well)



Five unsharpened No. 2 pencils with erasers; secure together with a rubber band



Five black or blue ballpoint pens (no gel ink); secure together with a rubber band



One 21/2" eraser
