

Remember last spring when we held various fundraisers for youth going to camp? Remember our exciting Marinara and Melodies concert? Well, this month we're featuring two of our youth who benefitted from those fundraisers.



Over the summer, Jocelyn Weber and Austin Tatuaca attended Lutheran Summer Music camp at Valparaiso University. Founded in 1981, Lutheran Summer Music (LSM) is billed as "the nation's premier faith-based music academy for high school students."

Jocelyn, a sophomore bassoon player, reports:

"Attending Lutheran Summer Music was an incredible opportunity for me to grow both as a musician and in faith. While at LSM, I met many people from all across the country who I got to know both as musicians and as people. I made many friends there, (some who even live as far as New York!), that I still keep in touch with and can't wait to see again next summer. This experience allowed me to spend my time doing what I love as a musician and growing in my faith, in a beautiful community of people who all had so much in common. I was able to learn many new things from the people around me and spend my time around people who I was truly blessed to have met. I am so incredibly grateful for having been able to have this incredible experience at LSM and for all the people who helped make this possible for me."

Austin, a bass clarinet player who is a freshman this year, had this to say:

"The best part about Lutheran Summer Music was to see and make new friends with musical talent, and learn about musical knowledge I never knew before. My daily schedule would always have morning prayer before breakfast. I would spend the morning working on concert music with the full band, and learning different music notes in my musicianship class. I would usually be free for the rest of the afternoon to hang out with friends or practice. They had table tennis, pool tables, and



ultimate Frisbee. After dinner, there would usually be recitals to watch where we needed to dress nice, and after we would have a fantastic evening prayer. I learned about the different methods that some churches use, like singing a hymn and everybody singing back. LSM was a great experience and I am so thankful I got to go this summer!"
